Course Description

This course is a continuation of studies begun in MUS 121. Emphasis is placed on advanced melodic, rhythmic, and harmonic analysis and continued studies in part-writing, ear-training, and sight-singing. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate proficiency in the recognition and application of the above. This course has been approved for transfer under the CAA and ICAA as a premajor and/or elective course requirement.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- o Effectively read and comprehend music at an advanced level.
- o Execute proper notation of pitch, rhythm, scales, and chords in all keys and clefs.
- o Demonstrate principles of appropriate voice leading.
- o Identify and notate diatonic chords in major and minor keys.
- o Diagram the formal structure of musical excerpts.
- o Recognize and label non-chord tones within a musical passage.
- o Compose an original work demonstrating concepts of part writing, voice leading, and proper notation practices within the Western art music tradition.
- Analyze excerpts from the standard classical repertoire using Roman numerals, figured bass symbols, and commercial chord symbols.

Micro-Assessments

- Quizzes will be given in class to assess student comprehension of the material. No make up quizzes will be given.
- All homework assignments are due at the beginning of class. If the student knows they will be absent from class on a due date, the assignment must be submitted to the instructor early to receive credit. No late assignments will be accepted.
- o In-class assignments include individual and group activities pertaining to the content. A student must be present and participating in an in-class activity to receive credit. No credit will be given to students not in class during these assignments. To account for unexpected circumstances and absences, the lowest three micro-assessments will be dropped.

Exams

Exams dates will be announced at least two weeks before the exam is administered. No make-up exams will be given unless the student notifies the instructor prior to the exam and receives written approval from the instructor.
